Although we address online safety throughout the year, we will be marking Safer Internet Day, taking place next Tuesday. The theme this year is:

"Together for a Better Internet"

Our Early Years children will be having age appropriate discussions about staying safe on the internet and when to spot when something doesn't look right.

Key Stage 1 will be bringing home a 'Safe to Share' sheet. We would like this to be discussed and completed at home, thinking about what images, messages etc are safe and great to share. Our aim is to teach the children how to use devices safely, rather than not using them at all.

Key Stage 2 will be engaging in an online workshop with Manchester City in the Community.
