Free School Meals

Important message for Year 2 Parents: from September, your child will no longer be eligible for Universal Free School Meals. You will need to either provide a packed lunch or pay for school meals. I have attached a letter with a return slip to indicate your preference for September. We will also send a paper copy of this home next week.

Are you eligible for Free School meals?

Anybody can apply for Free School meals if they meet the following criteria:

- Income Support
- Universal Credit (provided your household income is less than £7,400 a year after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- income related Employment and Support Allowance
- income based Job Seekers Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit only with an income of less than £16,190
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit

Even if your child doesn't want to take a school meal, we strongly urge you to register as this generates income for the school (up to £1300 per child) which can be spent on resources to support your child to make the best possible progress as well as in other areas which may be needed.

To apply, you will need your National Insurance number and to follow this <u>link</u> to complete the online form. If you need support with this, please contact our school office who will assist you with the application.
