Your Child's Starting Point.

The Early Years Foundation Stage outlines 'Age Related Expectations' (AREs) over seven areas of learning: Communication & language, Physical, Personal, Social & Emotional, Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts & Design. As your child is settling into school during these first few weeks, we will be completing class assessments and a statutory Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA) to gather information on your child's starting points and their next steps for learning. Your child's progress towards these expectations will be shared with you throughout the year.

Learning at Home

We love to hear about what your child has learnt or achieved at home e.g. swimming, riding their bike, getting dressed all by themselves, going to Rainbows, Beavers, karate, dancing, football clubs etc. Please record these magic moments by taking photos or videos and putting them on Dojo or emailing them to us so we can celebrate with your child in school.

Door closes – late arrivals will have to sign in at the school office. 9am – Literacy session begins promptly (please don't be late because we can't wait!) 9.30 – 10.45am – morning activities including access to snack area. 10.45 – 11.05am – Phonics session 11.15am – children go to hall for lunch followed by outdoor session 1.15pm – Register, followed by a Maths session 1.45 – 2.45pm – afternoon activities including access to snack area. 2.45pm – story/singing 3.10pm – Home time. Please collect your child by 3.15pm
EVERY DAY - Please make sure your child has all their reading resources and diary in school once they have received them.
TUESDAY – Forest Schools – Each class will have a turn for a half term, starting with class Mrs Revill's class - EYR. Children to wear black joggers/leggings and white T-shirts every Tuesday please and bring wellies/waterproofs– see letter. WEDNESDAY – PE – ALL CHILDREN please come to school wearing black joggers/leggings, white T-shirts and Velcro

fastening trainers or pumps every Wednesday.

FRIDAY - Early Years Assembly – We choose the next 'Star of the Week' and award certificates for good behaviour, working hard, trying challenges, working independently, great thinking and ideas and lots more!
