Topic

We enjoy many exciting topics in Lower Key Stage 2 which enable us to cover all aspects of the National Curriculum. Our topic this term is the Ancient Greeks; we will be looking at timelines, daily life, religion, and the far-reaching legacy of this fascinating ancient civilisation.



English



Our English sessions will be based on a lovely picture book called 'Journey', and our exciting history topic including Myths and Legends.

We will be continuing to follow the Spelling Shed approach to spelling, with regular focus work and investiga-

tions. We will also continue to teach reading using a whole-class approach, referring to the 'VIPERS' (vocabulary, inferring, predicting, explaining, retrieving and summarising) as we teach these skills.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths we follow the National Curriculum and Age Related Expectations (AREs). We will begin our Maths work this year by revisiting some times tables from last year followed by the place value of 3 and 4-digit numbers.

All Year 4 children are required to sit a times tables test in the Summer term; this checks knowledge of the multiplication tables up to 12x12 and the questions are very fast-paced. We will be working on times tables knowledge in school but regular practice at home is essential. We recommend using Times Table

Rockstars, www.timestables.co.uk, as well as chanting and repetition to cement the children's recall of these. We will send some weekly fluency homework to support this.



Homework

Topic

The children will be given a choice from different curriculum areas and they need to complete a minimum of two challenges, however we would **love** to see them challenge themselves and complete additional tasks—especially those from the top of the layered 'chilli challenge' chart. Please send homework in via Class Dojo so your child can share their work with their classmates. We can't wait to see what you get up to!

Reading

We will be teaching reading using the whole-class format regularly throughout the week. Please encourage your child to <u>read every</u> <u>night at home</u> and ensure that you sign in their reading diary.



Snacks

The children should bring a named water bottle into school every day—water only in class. They can also bring a healthy snack at break time. This is especially helpful after swimming.



<u>PE</u>

PE will be taught by class teachers during the week for the first half term. Please remember to send your child in wearing their kit: black joggers or leggings, white t-shirt and their school jumper with trainers. They should not be wearing clothes with brand names on. Please could children not wear earrings on these days and long hair should be tied up. Tuesday: Year 3 PE, Year 4 swimming, Friday PE as a class. No baggy swim shorts, earrings or goggles for swimming and those with long hair need a swimming cap.
