Where does a clownfish live?

Clownfish live at the bottom of the sea in sheltered reefs or lagoons. Found in warm waters in the Pacific and Indian Oceans but also around Australasia, they live in an anemone so are sometimes called anemone fish. They help the anemone by eating algae which keeps it clean. Clownfish live in pairs. The anemones can be poisonous to other fish so Clownfish can hide in them.
