What does a clownfish eat?

Clownfish are omnivores. This means they eat meat and plants. They eat algae, zooplankton, worms and small crustaceans (shellfish). Small fish stay where it is safe but as they grow bigger, they start to find their own food. Large fish such as sharks and eels are a predator of Clownfish.
